First panel meeting

Participants analyse the status quo in their policy area and identify the main challenges the Union will have to tackle. They use precise concept and provide concrete examples. <u>Expected outcome</u>: an analytical description of the status quo and a list of challenges

PANEL MEETING 2 - 13:30-15:30

Second panel meeting

Participants define an objective based on shared values. They propose a list of 3 to 5 concrete actions to be undertaken as a priority and divide into sub-groups to detail each action. <u>Expected outcome</u>: the definition of a shared objective and a list of 3-5 concrete actions

Coffee Break - 30 minutes

PANEL MEETING 3 - 16:00-17:30

Third panel meeting

Participants divide into sub-groups to detail each action. They put their work in common and elect a rapporteur to represent them in plenary.

Expected outcome: panel contributions to the final report

Participants go the the Assembly room - 30 minutes

PLENARY ASSEMBLY - 18:00-19:00

Vote on recommandations

- Rapporteurs of each panels submit their recommendations to the Assembly.
- The Assembly votes by a show of hands on the overall report to be submitted to European institutions.

Preparatory phase november 2021 - february 2022

The 200 participants to the first session of the European Student Assembly will gather on **March 4th, 2022 at Strasbourg**. This meeting will be the apex of a several months cooperation.



An <u>application form</u> has been sent to European Universitiy Alliances and published on <u>our website</u>. Three series of meetings will be organised to assist the selected students in the preparation of the event.

A first **information meeting** will gather all students and facilitators in December 2021 or early January 2022 to present the project and its objectives.

Each of the nine panel will meet twice between January and March 2022, with the help of a member of the organising team and a facilitator. Experts may be invited to help students identify the stakes and issues their panel will have to deal with.

The **9 facilitators** will participate to dedicated training sessions in parallel to work meetings.

In addition to preparing the debates, the students will have to mobilise their community and gather the opinions of their peers in each University.

Debating topics

During the preparation and the assembly meeting, participants will divide into **9 international and interdisciplinary panels** gathering 20 students each. These panels are structured around the main four topics of the Conference on the Future of Europe. Each will be assisted by a facilitator and a member of the organisation team.
